



MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE
GENERAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION
AND THE
DEFENSE LOGISTICS AGENCY


I. Objective and Authority

This agreement is entered into between the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) and General Service Administration (GSA) Federal Acquisition Service (FAS) under the provisions of 40 U.S.C. 121(e), formerly cited as Section 205(e) of the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949, and 40 U.S.C. 506(a)(2). In furtherance of the National Supply System concept, GSA and DLA are committed to eliminating duplication and overlap in their respective supply systems and providing responsive, effective and economical integrated materiel management to all Federal agencies in commonly used commodities.

II. Commodity Assignment and Transfer


To facilitate this goal, GSA hereby designates and authorizes DLA to procure and supply personal property and non-personal services and perform related functions in support of federal civil agencies, the Military Services and Defense Agencies, and all other authorized customers for items in Federal Supply Group (FSG) 80 (Hazmat). Accordingly, the Agreement Between the Department of Defense and the General Services Administration Governing Supply Management Relationships Under the National Supply System, dated February 19, 1971 is modified with respect to FSG 80.

All National Stock Numbers (NSNs) in FSG 80 are reassigned to DLA. As such, GSA transfers Integrated Materiel Management (IMM) responsibilities for Federal Supply Classes 8010, 8020, 8030 and 8040 to DLA. IMM is defined as managing, cataloging, demand and supply planning, requirements determination and definition, procurement, distribution, overhaul and repair of repairable materiel, and disposal of materiel.
